Identified issue: further development of subject leaders' understanding of curriculum intent focussing on effective planning and sequence of learning

Funding intention:

• to deliver high quality CPD to develop staff subject leadership knowledge and understanding

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Focussed Aim

Senior leaders have invested if the Alex Bedford UNITY Curriculum:

- to support planning of units of work
- to develop staff awareness of high-quality online resources
- to build in, ongoing regular assessments which will be mainly in the form of mini online quizzes
- to coach staff in planning sequenced activities to teach units of work
- to support delivery of lessons through coaching
- to develop skills in talking to pupils and carry out book looks to review pupil learning and building of skills
- to provide release time for SLT to facilitate all of the above

Intended outcomes

- increased pupil subject knowledge,
- increased staff confidence through discussions with pupils about recent learning
- evidence of systematic teaching in pupil books
- confident pupils excited about learning
- confident pupils excited to share knowledge with peers, staff, parents, wider community
- pupils able to draw on prior learning to support new learning
- increased resilience to engagement in learning
- improved classroom behaviour from disadvantaged/disengaged pupils
- evidence within books of cross curricular transference of knowledge and skills

Engagement:

• Ensure that disadvantaged pupils have positive attitudes to learning and demonstrate appropriate levels of engagement.

Monitoring:

- Curriculum leader/SLT to carry out half termly book looks and pupil talks.
- Subject leaders to feed back to whole staff at staff meeting
- Headteacher to report disadvantaged pupil progress to governors in termly Headteachers Report
